

Girraween High School Enrolment Policy

Girraween High School is a selective high school. Enrolment is based on a student attaining a high academic standard and having a record of successful involvement in school activities.

Applicants for enrolment must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia.

Enrolment in Year 7 is co-ordinated by the Selective Schools Unit of the Department of Education and Training. Applicants need to follow the processes and procedures set down by this unit. A selection committee representing the school monitors these processes and procedures. The selection committee is composed of the Principal of Girraween High, a parent from the school and the District Superintendent.

Enrolment in Years 8 to 12 is determined by a selection committee from the school in co-operation with the Selective Schools Unit. The Unit produces application forms for use in all selective schools

Enrolment is based on academic merit. In determining academic merit the selection committee will consider:

- School reports;
- Outstanding performance in areas, which the selection committee considers relevant;
- Additional relevant information as reported by parents.

Where two or more applicants have equal academic merit, the applicant with a family placement claim will be given priority.

Where two or more applicants have equal academic merit, students living closer to the school will be given priority.

Students who are enrolled in selective high schools will be given special consideration provided their work is of a suitable standard.

The selection committee will determine an order of merit for enrolment and students will be offered positions in the order established.
